Our TOSCA History

TOSCA was formed in 1993 through the efforts of Bob McConnell, the charter president of the organization, and we are so proud to be celebrating our 30th year of helping students realize their educational dreams.

A 15 member board of directors serves TOSCA with an advisory panel consisting of the principal of the middle school, the principal of the high school, the superintendent of the school district and a representative from the city council. The board of directors conducts monthly meetings.

Every dollar contributed to TOSCA goes into scholarships as all board members are community volunteers.

TOSCA serves as a scholarship clearing house for many clubs and organizations who do not have the resources to reach each and every graduate of the Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District. Through TOSCA's efforts, students have the means to apply for scholarship monies for up to 10 years after their graduation from high school. To date, over 2,500 students have taken advantage of this tremendous effort and have received over \$3,000,000 in scholarship monies and annuities.



Innovative Education Fund **TOSCA-PIE**

In December of 2000 Ernest L. Prien, contributed \$1,000,000 to TOSCA. Two endowment funds were created from this generous gift; A \$500,000 scholarship fund for college undergraduates and college graduates seeking further degrees and the remaining \$500,000 to form the TOSCA-PIE fund.




TOSCA-PIE grants, totaling as much as \$40,000 a year, have been awarded each year. Interest from the original \$500,000 investment funded these grants.

The TOSCA-Prien Innovative Education Fund (TOSCA-PIE) is dedicated to enriching education in the Newman-Crows Landing Unified School District. The fund seeks to form a bond between community members who care deeply about the public schools and those who are creatively carrying out the education of our children.

Mr. Prien had a great love for this community. He attended Newman schools. He graduated from Orestimba Union High School (1931) and from the University of California School of Pharmacy in San Francisco.

He returned to Newman as a pharmacist at the Pioneer Drug Store (the red brick building at 435 Main Street) in 1935. Six years later, in 1941, Mr. Prien bought Pioneer Drug.

Mr. Prien and two partners started a wholesale pharmaceutical business in 1948 - supplying the needs of drug stores throughout the San Joaquin Valley. In 1957, a



Pioneer Drug which was then located in the St. Clair Corner Building. The drug service prospered and

eventually nine branches were established in California and Washington. His next venture was the developing of a hospital service and supply corporation serving out eleven western states.

He, himself, was an extremely innovative individual.

Grant Award

Utilizing Technology to Increase Science Skills

Orestimba High School 9-12 Science Department \$12,738.97

For the purchase of "Vernier Probes and Sensors" to provide students the opportunity to collect, analyze, and communicate their own data with the result being a deeper understanding of science concepts. The probes and sensors utilize an interface to send data directly to their Chromebooks and the data can then be graphed and statistically analyzed for various uses such as written reports and multi-media presentations.

The Vernier Probes and Sensors will:

- provide an innovative way to data collection and interpretation.
- allow students to carry out experiments during inquiry based activities
- science concepts will be discovered firsthand
- increase in the academic level of student questioning
- greater desire for student active participation
- increase in academic discourse
- be a highly effective teaching tool to raise rigor and relevance in the classroom

The primary objective of this grant is to increase student understanding of science content and boost their ability to analyze data sets and graphs. Increasing the opportunities for students to perform hands-on activities will increase their engagement in the classroom.

Annie Amaral Wemorial Scholarship

Given by the Annie Amaral Memorial Endowment

Annie was a life-long resident of Crows Landing. Together with her husband, Tony, they raised four children and enjoyed their family life. Annie showed a great amount of unwavering strength and boundless compassion as she cared for her husband once he was diagnosed with Multiple Sclerosis. She exemplified a standard to which we all could aspire. Annie was best known for her competitive edge when it came to playing cards, particularly Shanghai Rummy. Annie's greatest joy was her grandchildren, great-grandchildren and generations of nieces and nephews.

Tony Amaral Vnemorial Scholarship

Tony Amaral of Crows Landing was best known as "Swede" because of his blond hair and blue eyes in a large Portuguese family. His greatest love, besides his family, was racing the family cars. He had a very strong work ethic and loved farming.

Stanley & Fennie Arnett Vnemorial Scholarship

Fennie & Stanley Arnett migrated to California from Oklahoma during the Great Depression and the Dust Bowl in 1937. They loaded all their belongings plus 3 children in a Model A Ford car and made the journey along with many other migrants to California. Fennie & Stanley and their children worked the harvest seasons which included picking cotton, fruits, vegetables, and any other jobs which were available to help finance and sustain the two-year trip to California which included the birth of their fourth child.... truly an example of "The Grapes of Wrath". They settled in the central valley and raised their family of 12 children..

Ben & Dorothy Arnhold Memorial Scholarships

Given by the Ben and Dorothy Arnhold Memorial Endowment

Ben's first trip to Newman was after the earthquake and fire in San Francisco in 1906. He came to stay with his grand-uncle Simon Newman and his family came a little later while his father stayed in the city to repair their home. Ben returned in 1917 to work at the Simon Newman Store but volunteered for service. After the war, he returned and established his own business Newman Security Company in the Russ House. When he retired he had been in business for almost 60 years in Newman.

Mrs. Arnhold was a school teacher in Sebastopol, CA and loved students of all ages. When she and Ben were married they made their home together in Newman and they were involved in Newman's prominent clubs and organizations and lived here until they both passed. They loved this community and the people who lived here and wanted to pay forward their successes in life. Though they never had any children of their own – their love of education and citizenship lives on in this endowment.
